

Instructions for Fabric Paints

General Description

Completely permanent, non-cracking, non-peeling, light-fast colours.

Fabric remains supple and stitchable.

All colours are intermixable creating, an infinite number of additional hues and tints.

Simple to use for fabric painting and also screen printing, stamping, stencilling and airbrushing.

These highly pigmented fabric paints produce extremely soft professional results on both natural and synthetic fabrics.

They are also ideal for use as a general craft paint.

UK manufactured, Non-toxic, VOC free, wheat and gluten free.

You will need

- Printing substrate (e.g. t-shirt, cotton bag, apron)
- Iron (1400w or higher) & a suitable heat-resistant flat surface for ironing
- You may prefer to bake the fabric instead of ironing so in this case, pre-heat the oven to 140°C
- Paint Brush(es)
- Paint Palette (to mix colours as required)
- Water for cleaning brushes after use

1. Preparation

- Iron the substrate prior to painting for about a minute, to warm it up a little & smooth out any creases.

2. Mixing Colours

- White: To create pastel tones - add a small amount of white a little at a time to other colours until the desired shade is achieved.
- Black: To create shades add a small amount of black a little at a time to other colours until the desired shade is achieved.
- Water: The paints can also be diluted by up to 10% water.



3. Application & Fixing

- Apply the paint to the material and allow to air-dry. Ensure design is not tacky prior to moving to the next step.
- Heat the iron to a hot setting, being careful to test it in an unseen area to ensure it will not mark the material.
- Ensure the steam setting is switched OFF on the iron.
- Prepare a flat and solid surface on which to iron. Cover the surface with an old tea towel or similar to give it slight cushioning & to protect it from the heat.
- Iron the design on the reverse of the fabric for 2 minutes.
- You may prefer to bake the fabric, however this is dependant on its makeup and we recommend testing first to ensure this process is suitable. If baking, do so for 4-5 minutes.

4. Washing Instructions

- Your finished item(s) are washable by hand.
- It is worth checking the washing instructions/care guide of the substrate you have chosen to print the transfer onto, in case these differ.
